- Sub:
1. Comprehensive list of all pre-establishment, pre-operation, post-commencement, renewals and other approvals under the Boiler Laws.
 2. Risk categorization of boiler inspections & inspection schedule of boilers under the Boiler Laws.

The Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP), Govt. of India has introduced "Ease of Doing Business (EODB), wherein it is required to declare a comprehensive list of pre-establishment, pre operation, post-commencement and other statutory approvals/certifications etc essential under the Boiler Laws.

It is also required to intimate about risk categorization of boiler inspections and inspection schedule of boiler under the provision of the Boiler Acts, 1923, Indian Boiler Regulations, 1950 and Assam Boiler Rules, 1935.

I. Comprehensive list of pre-establishment, pre-operation, post-commencement, renewals & returns and other approvals / Registrations / Permission / NOC / Renewals etc required under the Boiler Laws-



1.	Pre-establishment approvals	NIL
2.	Pre-operation approvals	I) Registration of Boiler/ Economizer under provision of the Boilers Act, 1923. II) Approval and Certification of pipeline under Indian Boiler Regulation 1950. III) Approval for fabrication and erection of pipeline/boiler/economizer under Reg.392 of IBR,1950. IV) Transfer of ownership of boiler/ economizer.
3.	Post-Commencement approvals	NIL
4.	Renewals and Returns	I) Renewal of certificate of Boiler under the Boilers Act, 1923. II) Renewal of certificate of pipeline under Indian Boiler Regulations, 1950.
5.	Other approvals	I) Approval for modification , alteration, addition, and repairing of boiler/ economizer/steam pipeline.

II. Risk categorization of boiler inspections and inspection schedule of Boilers under the Boilers Laws:

Boilers are pressure vessels designed to produce steam at high pressure and temperature with the help of combustions of one of several fuels such as oil, coal, natural gas, wood, biomass etc. Solar energy, nuclear fission can also be used as a heat source for steam generation. Due to explosive nature the physical inspection & testing of boilers is mandatory under the Act and hence, the inspection of boiler may be categorized in Red (high risk) category.

Sl No	Category	Inspection schedule
1	Red (High Risk)	On receipt of application for registration and renewal of certificate of boilers, under Sec. 7 & 8 of the Boilers Act, 1923, statutory inspection, testing, examination and certification are provided by the Inspectorate as per Indian Boiler Regulation, 1950, as follows- I) All Fired Boiler : To be inspected once in a year. II) All waste Heat Boiler : To be inspected once in 2 Years.
